



Wallingford Day

Friday, 21st August 2015



Discover historic Wallingford, situated on the banks of the River Thames and retaining many older houses and other buildings. Spend the morning taking a guided tour around the original ramparts of Wallingford old town and the castle ruins, then cross the river to Crowmarsh Gifford for lunch followed by talks and discussions in the afternoon. Alternatively, for those who prefer not to undertake a walk, join the Historic Pathways and River Crossings Workshop in the morning.

- 16.00 – 17.00 Wallingford Museum is open for those who would like to visit.

The cost for the day will be £10 per person including lunch (sandwiches, quiche, fruit, cheese and a drink)
