Dr David Marsh, continues as our speaker for this 4-lecture course. He is a Trustee of The Gardens Trust, a national campaigning body for the protection and support of our historic parks and gardens and designed landscapes. He is co-chair of their Education and Events committee. As before the morning will be divided into two sessions of about an hour each with a short break in between. The third lecture looks at the growth of interest amongst the 19th century middle class and how technology changed the face of our gardens, whilst the fourth, and final, lecture considers how the mass media has changed gardening in the 20th century.
